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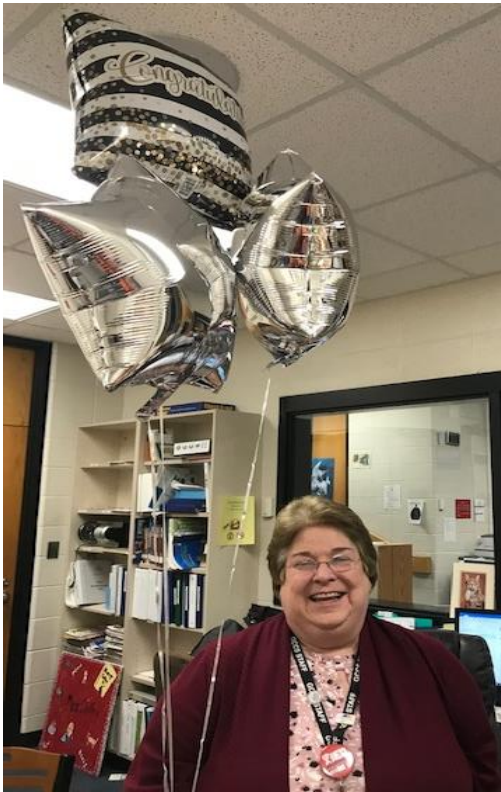

The Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) administration is right around the corner on **March 1**. With as many tests as our students take, why should they care about taking the SAT? It's a valid question! Here are 5 great reasons students should put forth their best effort while taking the SAT on March 1:

1. **SAT offered during the school day is free of charge to students**

The test would typically cost students \$55 and they would have to drive to a testing center.

2. **Scores open doors to colleges**

Plans change! You may need test scores in the future if you decide later to go to college or change colleges. If you score higher on this SAT than any previous SAT tests you've taken, colleges may "super score," or use the highest scores from each SAT you've taken.

3. **Make your name available to scholarship programs**

Students who take the SAT and opt-in to the Student Search Service are connected to millions of dollars in scholarship opportunities.

4. **Some schools award scholarships based upon qualifying SAT scores**

Having SAT scores could make students eligible for more scholarships.

5. **Balance a lower GPA**

A strong score on the SAT may show colleges your true potential if your GPA does not accurately reflect your ability. This is a way to demonstrate to college admissions committees how far you have advanced academically throughout your high school years.
